

COME TELL AT&T “NO CELL TOWER” AT 1095 CHANNING AVE.

*AT&T and the Roman Catholic Welfare Corp. of San Jose want to build a 50 ft. cell tower in the middle of our Palo Alto residential neighborhood (R-1 zoned) on top of St. Albert the Great Church and St. Elizabeth Seton School, as close as 130 ft to homes and on top of 300 kids.
There are already 13 cell towers within 1 mile of the proposed site.
6 of the 13 belong to AT&T.*

The City of Palo Alto has required that AT&T hold a community meeting to “discuss” their proposal to bring our neighborhood an unnecessary cell tower AND:

DEVALUATION OF HOMES – Peer-reviewed studies show that property values decline 20% near cell towers. Buyers are coached to express health concerns about nearby cell towers to drive prices down. Palo Alto real estate professionals are against this cell tower proposal.

CELL TOWER “HUM” – Cell antennas are not silent. Noise levels of a 50 ft. cell tower can violate noise ordinances designed for residential equipment at ground level. The vibrations and hum are constant, causing many residents to lose sleep and sanity.

24x7 MAINTENANCE – The cell tower requires 24x7 on-site maintenance of equipment, with trucks, lights, lifts, radios, & heavy equipment outside your window at 2AM.

PORTABLE GENERATORS – Trailer-mounted generators are brought in to power cell sites through power outages, bringing excessive noise and pollution, and run 24x7 as needed.

VISUAL NUISANCE & PRIVACY – The proposed cell tower is 50 ft. tall, at least 12 ft. taller than surrounding structures, and looks directly down into children's bedrooms.

HEALTH ISSUES – AT&T's “science” is as questionable as their marketing...

Were you one of the *lucky few* to get AT&T's notice of a community meeting? If yes, you saw...

AT&T thinks our neighborhood is called "Crescent Heights."

AT&T shows a picture of the proposed tower from behind the school – **a view that no-one will see.** From the street, we'll have an unobstructed view of a 50' tower.

AT&T edited the existing church tower out of their picture – did they think we wouldn't notice?

What else has AT&T done for us?

California's state-wide cable franchise law, DIVCA – a corporate welfare bill for AT&T passed in 2006 – threatens our schools' current gigabit Internet network. *Thanks, AT&T!*

AT&T's IPTV moves our community PEG channels "off the dial," banished to a graveyard of community television that takes 30 seconds to access per channel and can't be recorded on DVR. No recording City Council meetings for IPTV customers! *Thanks, AT&T!*
